Cheddar Man	A human male fossil found in Gough's cave in Cheddar Gorge, Somerset, England. He died a violent death around 7150BC.
Boxgrove Man	A 500,000 year old fossil found in Boxgrove, West Sussex. Only two pieces of the tibia two teeth were found.
